Get the data of a section from the table view. The data is selected in the first half of the table view. In the first action, `dataSource` is the table view, and `sectionIndexTitles` is the section index. In the second action, `dataSource` is the table view, and `sectionIndexTitles` is the section index. The number in the `updateCallback` is the number of rows changed. When the data is edited and the following cells is inserted into the scroll view, the data is copied into the system clipboard. This code will be used in the handler of the `ScrollView`.
